Roundup: A.L. Wins Twice in Treynor

TREYNOR – Abraham Lincoln used effective pitching Saturday to earn two victories at the Treynor Baseball Classic.

The Lynx earned a 7-3 victory over Woodbine in their first game. Dillon Sass scattered six hits in the complete-game effort.

Fine pitching also lifted the Lynx past Treynor later in the day. Nolan Webster struck out nine in a 9-2 A.L. victory. He also helped himself at the plate with a double.

The solid pitching rested the Lynx's bullpen and earned the praise of A.L. coach James Larsen.

“They both were grooving and pitching smart,” Larsen said of Sass and Webster. “Our defense backed them up well.

“Our kids expected to win these ballgames. Woodbine and Treynor kept our rallies down, but we didn't really shoot ourselves in the foot. It was a decent day of baseball.”

A.L. infielder Dan Wettengel finished the day with four hits and four runs scored.

The Lynx won't return to action until Thursday, when they face cross-town rival Thomas Jefferson.
